







Access Programs

Purpose: Increase access to mental healthcare for the most marginalized youth by removing financial barriers, promoting wellness activities, advocating for policy change, and advancing diversity, equity, and inclusion across all settings.

Mental Health Access Assistance

✓ 19 mental health care providers supported 64 patients with therapy sessions by covering copays and deductibles.

✓ 2,214 therapy visits covered for children and parents in Mental Health Access Assistance. Seeking mental healthcare shouldn't be a financial burden. We can help.

Over 40 newly licensed clinicians serving Lancaster County since 2020.


